It is with great pride that we share the exciting story of how your gifts to the Foundation have advanced the mission of Kootenai Health. Since 1983 over \$15.5 million has been invested to directly benefit patient care, including \$2.5 million in 2015 to support the hospital's expanded Family Birth Center, neonatal intensive care unit, orthopedics and neurosurgery patient care units.

The growth and expansion of care are a direct result of the changing needs of our patients. With higher levels of care available closer to home, Kootenai Health is serving more patients with greater needs. This requires a higher intensity of physician and nursing care, combined with cutting edge equipment, technology and facilities to care for these patients.

Kootenai Health operates successfully in the current environment of increasing regulation and decreasing reimbursements, but not without a great deal of collaboration, quality partnerships and the willingness to adapt and change.

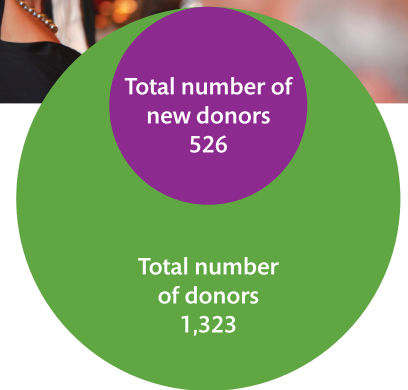

28th Annual Festival of Trees was a HUGE Success!

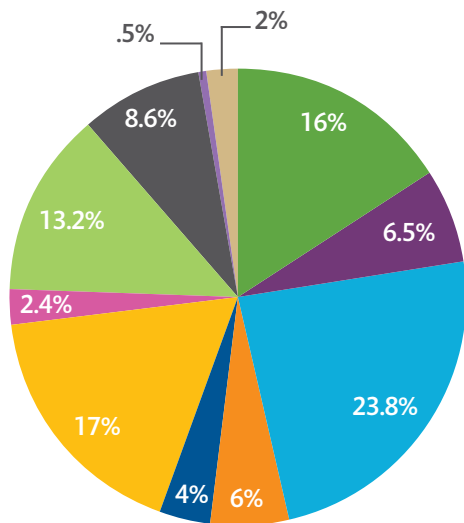
